

Gospel of Matthew Chapter 2, verses 1-12

¹In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ²asking, "Where is the child who has

been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: ⁶'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." ⁷Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Deuteronomy 11:11-12-"But the land that you are crossing over to occupy is a land of hills and valleys, watered by rain from the sky, a land that the LORD your God looks after. The eyes of the LORD your God are always on it, from the beginning of the year to the end of the year."

"All my life's a circle, sunrise and sundown, the moon rolls through the nighttime, 'till the daybreak comes around, all my life's a circle, but I can't tell you why, the seasons spinning round again, the years keep rolling by".-Harry Chapin

I've long been a fan of the music of the late Harry Chapin, particularly his song "The Circle". I heard it for the first time at a pastor's gathering during my internship year, and I've loved it ever since. Chapin recognized that each year, there are so many things that don't change-the four seasons come and go, the moon goes through its phases, the sun rises and sets. Yet Chapin confesses that he doesn't know why this happens, year after year. Science can tell us how this happens, and give us a technical explanation as to why, but they've never yet answered the big question-Why does this universe, with its annual cycle of the seasons, exist? Why is there something and not nothing? Why is this universe so perfectly tuned to support human life? Some ancient cultures believed that the universe was the fallout from a battle between many different gods. Some see the universe as the result of a random series of collisions between different forces. But Christians and Jews believe that the universe is the result of a deliberate act of creation by God. We are here because God wants us here, and the universe is designed for us and for all creatures. Some believe that God indeed designed the universe, and then walked away and left us to our own devices, but Christians and Jews believe, as the scripture from Deuteronomy points out, that God is always watching us and remains active in our universe. Creation is an ongoing process that has continued through the centuries. When the time was right, God came into the world in the person of Jesus Christ, taking on human flesh, living the life that we live, showing forth the love and mercy of God in His life, and making it possible for all to have eternal life with God by His death and resurrection. Jesus has promised that while for now life is indeed a circle, with the days and months and seasons repeated year after year, that the circle will not continue forever, but one day He will return, completing a new creation in which we all know that we are surrounded by the presence of Christ. Each New Year brings us closer to that day.

And in each New Year until then, we are comforted by the presence of God, who is with us and watching over us. May you all have the happiest of New Years, and may God's peace be with you, throughout 2025 and always.

Every year, Christians around the world are invited to celebrate a Week of Prayer for the unity of all Christians, to reflect on scripture together, to participate in jointly-organized ecumenical services, and to share fellowship.

January 18th thru 25th, in the Northern Hemisphere, is the annual observance of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The guiding biblical text for the Week of Prayer is (John 11:17-27), with the theme for the week, "Do you believe this?" (v. 26) and takes its cue from the dialogue between Jesus and Martha when Jesus visited the home of Martha and Mary in Bethany following the death of their brother Lazarus. Churches of all faiths are called together to form a vibrant and prayerful witness for Christian Unity by heeding Jesus' prayer "that they all may be one."

2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, near Constantinople in 325 A.D.
